Course Description: An advanced workshop using the principles, procedures, and techniques of television production. The course includes video control, special effects, operation of cameras and editing machines, composition, lighting, staging, and directing, on-camera announcing and interviewing.

Course Objectives: To obtain a working knowledge of television systems and equipment through completing a series of videos for clubs, classes, Cypress Bay Sports and CBTV's Aftershock.

Class Participation/Attendance: This TV course is a hands-on classroom learning experience. **Participation is required, and attendance is mandatory.**

Late Assignments: In the real world, deadlines must be met to air a show successfully. In an attempt to prepare each student for working in the industry, late assignments will not be accepted.

Class Assignments: This course will include producing television programming for Cypress Bay High School students, teachers and staff. (See Website)

Assessments: Assessment is based on breakdowns below.

Note: Grades on all video projects are subject to the total discretion of the teacher.

Grading Breakdown

30%-Class Assignments (Paperwork, Reviews, etc.)

60%- Video Segments

10%-CBTV Points

Demerit System-will also be assessed for being off task and factored in at the end of the semester.

Behavioral Expectation:

3. When working in the studio you must wear shoes with closed toes and backs.

Failure to follow dress code will result in a ZERO grade for that day.

Equipment Responsibility: The cameras and editing computers are a privilege for you to use throughout your enrollment in this course. (See equipment contract).

CBTV Membership: CBTV is a co-curricular club within the Television Production class. Membership in the club is \$45 per school year and includes membership to organizations such as SkillsUSA, FSPA, and STN. All students will become members of these organizations. Each Television Production course is a prerequisite for all other television classes offered at Cypress Bay High School. Moving into the advanced classes is dependent upon your behavior and work in this class. A signature is required from the instructor for further enrollment.
