Course Description: An introduction to the basic principles, procedures, and techniques of television production. This course includes the three phases of television production. This course will also cover television history, laws, ethics, and employability skills.

Course Objectives: To obtain a working knowledge of television systems and equipment.

Course Text: Television Production and Broadcast Journalism (students may access additional textbook materials from the class webpage), Adobe Premiere CS6 Classroom in a Book

Class Participation/Attendance: This TV course is a hands-on classroom learning experience. **Participation is required, and attendance is mandatory.** If you miss class, it is your responsibility for finding out what was covered while you were gone. Notes and other materials passed out will be posted on the class website.

Late Assignments: In the real world, deadlines must be met to air a television show successfully. In an attempt to prepare each student for working in the industry, late video project will be lowered **1 letter grade** each day it is late. Students missing days during video projects must schedule time before or after school to make up time if necessary. If a student misses days during a group video assignment an alternative assignment will be given.

Class Assignments: This course will include various projects, quizzes, and practical exams in order to evaluate your understanding of all aspects of television production.

Assessments: Assignments are weighted according to the following scale.

Equipment Responsibility: The cameras and editing computers are a privilege for you to use throughout your enrollment in this course. Mistreatment of the equipment and/or computers will result in removal from the course. **(See Equipment Contract)**

Behavioral Expectation:

CBTV Membership: CBTV is a co-curricular club within the Television Production class. Membership in the club is \$45 per school year and includes membership to organizations such as SkillsUSA, FSPA, and STN. All students will become members of these organizations. Television Production 1 is a prerequisite for all other television classes offered at Cypress Bay High School. Moving into the advanced classes is dependent upon your behavior and work in this class. A signature is required from the instructor for further enrollment.
