Course Description: This course will cover advanced television studio and field production operations. Students will apply terms and skills learned in previous Television Production at Cypress Bay High School. Students will complete a series of video productions to prepare for initial employment in the television field.

Course Objectives: To obtain a working knowledge of television systems and equipment by creating a daily morning newscast and completing a series of video projects leading to certification in Adobe software.

Class Participation/Attendance: This TV course is a hands-on classroom learning experience. **Participation is required, and attendance is mandatory.** Final grades will be affected by poor attendance.

Late Assignments: In the real world, deadlines must be met to air a show successfully. In an attempt to prepare each student for working in the industry, late assignments will not be accepted.

Class Assignments: This course will include producing television programming for Cypress Bay High School students, teachers and staff, while training to become Adobe Certified Associate Editors. **ALL STUDENTS WILL TAKE THE CERTIFICATION EXAM AS THE MIDTERM RETAKES WILL BE THE FINAL EXAM.**

Assessments: Assessment is based on breakdowns below.

Note: Grades on all video projects are subject to the total discretion of the teacher.

Behavioral Expectation:

3. All talent appearing on camera must dress in a professional manner. T-shirts are not acceptable. CBTV polo shirts may be purchased.
4. Students not properly dressed for studio activities will receive a ZERO grade for that day.

Equipment Responsibility: The cameras and editing computers are a privilege for you to use throughout your enrollment in this course. (See equipment contract).

CBTV Membership: CBTV is a co-curricular club within the Television Production class. Membership in the club is \$45 per school year and includes membership to organizations such as SkillsUSA, FSPA, and STN. All students will become members of these organizations. Each Television Production course is a prerequisite for all other television classes offered at Cypress Bay High School. Moving into the advanced classes is dependent upon your behavior and work in this class. A signature is required from the instructor for further enrollment.
