Course Description: An advanced workshop using the basic principles, procedures, and techniques of television production. The course includes video control, special effects, operation of cameras and editing machines, composition, lighting, staging, and directing, on-camera announcing and interviewing.

Course Objectives: To obtain a working knowledge of television systems and equipment through completing a series of videos for clubs, classes, Cypress Bay Sports and a variety of competitions.

Class Participation/Attendance: This TV course is a hands-on classroom learning experience. **Participation is required, and attendance is mandatory.**

Late Assignments: In the real world, deadlines must be met to air a show successfully. In an attempt to prepare each student for working in the industry, late assignments will not be accepted.

Class Assignments: This course will include producing television programming for Cypress Bay High School students, teachers and staff. Students will also create videos to represent CBTV in local, state, and national competitions.

Assessments: Assessment is based on breakdowns below.

Note: Grades on all video projects are subject to the total discretion of the teacher.

30%- Class Assignments

10%-CBTV Points/Participation

Behavioral Expectation:

1. Respect yourself, your peers, your school and your instructor

Equipment Procedures:

1. To check out equipment you must have your check out card.
2. Equipment must be returned to class 5 minutes prior to the end of the period.
3. Lost or damaged equipment repairs or replacements will be the responsibility of the person the equipment is checked out to.

Equipment Responsibility: The cameras and editing computers are a privilege for you to use throughout your enrollment in this course. Mismanagement of the computers will result in strict penalties. (See equipment contract)

CBTV Membership: CBTV is a co-curricular club within the Television Production class. Membership in the club is \$45 per school year and includes membership to organizations such as SkillsUSA, FSPA, and STN. All students will become members of these organizations. For more information see a CBTV Officer.

Each Television Production course is a prerequisite for all other television classes offered at Cypress Bay High School. Moving into the advanced classes is dependent upon your behavior and work in this class. A signature is required from the instructor for further enrollment.
